**ROTARY CLUB OF SEMINOLE ECOLOGY PROJECT
TAMPA BAY PRO-AM 2012 APRIL 9-15, 2012**

Outback and OSI Restaurants are still involved and will have their presence in Billabong Club and other food offerings. The offerings for volunteers' lunches will continue to be offered from Carraba's, Leroy Selmon's and Bonefish Grill. Outback will just not be the title sponsor this year. The tournament continues to seek a title sponsor for this year and coming years.

The tournament has an increased relationship with the Convention and Visitors Bureau. A long-term arrangement has been signed with The Tampa Bay Lighting.

Because 2012 is considered a "bridge year" between title sponsors and the dollars lost,, this year attempts will be made to hold down expenses.

Because the television coverage has been switched from NBC (as a prelude to NHL game) to Golf Channel, where the tournament will be a feature and not have to be completed by 3:30 p.m. on Sunday afternoon, the Sunday play will commence and end later, anticipated to be 6:00 p.m. That will probably result in greater attendance on Sunday. First tee-off Sunday is slated to be 9:20 a.m. Television coverage is scheduled to be from 3:30 p.m. until 6:00 p.m. on Sunday. Golf Channel will carry live coverage of the tournament from 12:30 p.m. until 2:30 p.m. on Friday and 3:00 p.m. until 6:00 p.m. on Saturday.

There will be a full field of 81 golfers.

Because of the construction of a highway median in front of the TPC of Tampa Bay on Lutz Lake Fern Road, the entire traffic pattern will have to be changed. All volunteers will be dropped off by buses at the same location as the general public and will then have to walk to the Volunteer Tent. The road to the north of the Volunteer Tent, Terrain De Golf Drive, will be two lanes eastbound to exit the area. There will ne NO CART TRAFFIC on that road. The parking lot where the professional golfers park will be open for cart traffic.

There will be no "Green Hopper" area at Hole 16 green, which will be open to general admission.

There will be no bleachers placed behind the driving range.

Monday 9, 2012, will feature a Birdies for the Brave. This will be for military "wounded warriors" and will be a 12:30 p.m. shotgun start. The entire tournament will feature the military service and there will be a military ceremony on Sunday prior to the start of play.

Because Arnold Palmer Golf have not been secured to provide roping etc., our club might need to set out the trash boxes on the course on Sunday—Easter Sunday.

At the Leadership Meeting last week, Ecology and The Rotary Club of Seminole received nothing but praise about the service provided last year. Amy said that it was unbelievable how much trash was weighed in when taken to the dump.

We must get our hard-working friends to assist in this project, as we have done each year.

It is my desire to get this list filled very early and not at the last minute.

Anyone signed up for duty should be expected to spend the day at the tournament and should not leave until released by the Captain of the Day.
